1. Healthy Church Finance - Transparency

As I shared my stewardship story last month, today's message is also for our stewardship campaign. I would like to talk about healthy church finance.

I love this church. I love our church members. And I want to protect our church members, because I would not want anyone to find blame in how we manage what

we have. It is my absolute joy and responsibility to love and take care of this church. Sometimes, it is challenging and not easy, but it is my cross and my job. If there is something wrong, it is all my fault, because I am the pastor of this church. I am serious. It is all my fault. I am the one to be blamed. I think that this is one of the reasons why I am paid by the church.

The Church is a non-profit organization. Any organization has finances. To have healthy church finances, the church money needs to be **transparent**. Transparency means that church members can access the financial information. So, I will share our church's income, expenses, and saving accounts today. And I will share my own questions and some ministerial opportunities.

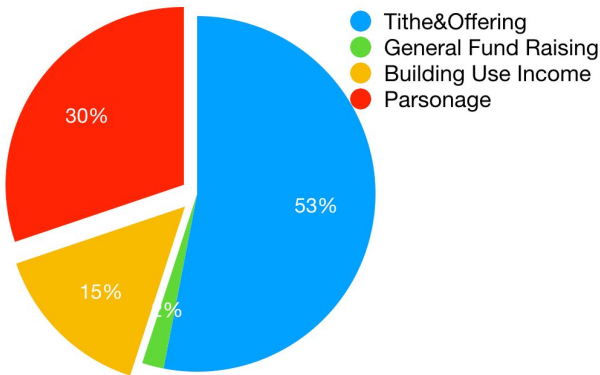
2. Gilroy UMC's 2018 Income

There are 4 categories of income. And this is the actual income in 2018 up until October 6th: Tithe & Offering, General Fund Raising, Building Use Income, and Parsonage Rent Fee. I categorize these into two: members' giving and outside income. The first two categories are our actual income. If we see this as a percentage, it is 55%, a little

more than half our income. Which is healthier, to live with medicine or to live without medicine? Sometimes, we need to take medicine. But if we can be healthy without medicine, it is better.

When we have more renters in our church building, we should be thankful. But we should not rely on this outside income. Our focus should be our own actual income.

3. Gilroy UMC’s 2018 Expense

There are many kinds of church expenses. So it is not easy to show all of that. But I will try. I categorize these into five. The first is related to **staff expense**: Pastor, Musician, Secretary, Custodian, and Guest Speakers. As you see, the pastor is the most expensive one.

last, is **Apportionment**. As a United

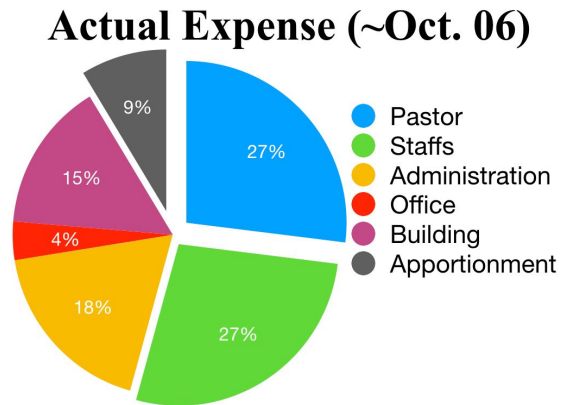

Methodist Church, we give conference apportionments, like a tithe. This is 10% of

our income. I also share our total income and total expense. We are very good at managing our church finances.

I would like to show you this as a percentage. Together, pastor and staff add up to 54%. The apportionment giving is almost 10%. To manage the church, we spend about 37%.



4. Saving Accounts & Ministerial Opportunities

Thankfully, we have some **savings funds**:

Parsonage Saving, Trimble Saving, Trustee Building Saving, Angel Memorial Fund, Sears Special Giving Fund, Burnson Hispanic Memorial Fund, and the

Apportionment Giving Fund. Actually, the Apportionment Giving Fund is not a saving fund, but I put this one here, because it has its own purpose. This total is \$35,937.

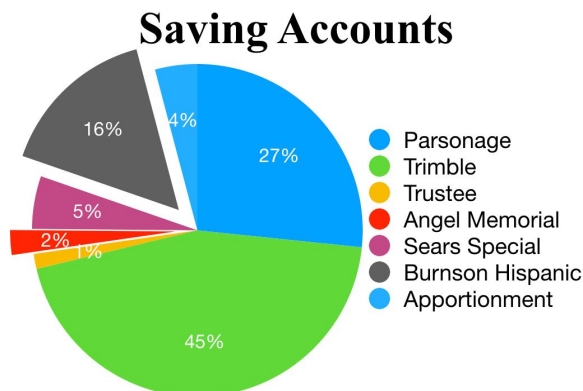
And we have an investment account. I heard that this **investment** is regarded as an

emergency fund in case of disaster. Among these saving funds, some are

designated funds: the Angel Memorial Fund and the Burnson Hispanic Memorial Fund have specific purposes: the Angel Memorial Fund is for those who need help, like the homeless; the Burnson Hispanic Memorial Fund is for migrant outreach.



Even though our church is small, I wondered how we use these savings funds. So I checked out when the last time was that we spent any of this money. Except for the Apportionment Giving Fund, we have not used any other savings
