2. The Church as the Vine

Have you seen a grapevine before? What does it look like? It produces grapes, because it is a grapevine. How many different kinds of grapes do you recognize? As you read in the scripture today, the vine has many branches. Does it have flowers? Have you seen them? Can you recognize grape leaves? What else does the vine have? Does it have a head? - Proclaim the gospel, seek, welcome and gather persons into the body of Christ;
- 2. Lead persons to commit their lives to God through baptism by water and the spirit and profession of faith in Jesus Christ;
- Nurture persons in Christian living through worship, the sacraments, spiritual disciplines, and other means of grace, such as Wesley's Christian conferencing;
- 4. Send persons into the world to live lovingly and justly as servants of Christ by healing the sick, feeding the hungry, caring for the stranger, freeing the oppressed, being and becoming a compassionate, caring presence, and working to develop social structures that are consistent with the gospel; and
- Continue the mission of seeking, welcoming and gathering persons into the community of the body of Christ.

Do you agree with these processes? What processes can you see in this church? What are our strengths? What are our weaknesses?

In my opinion, number 1 and 5 are the roots, which are hard to see, but they work like the roots: Seeking, Welcoming, and Gathering Persons in to the community of the Body of Christ. How do we seek? How can we welcome? How can we gather people? These should be our questions.

5. Abide in Love
